Meet Our 2020 Scholarship Recipients

The Muter Outdoor Fund is pleased to announce its third annual cohort of John A. Muter Memorial Scholarship recipients. The scholarship program, launched in 2018, recognizes college undergraduates who are committed to engaging new audiences and new generations with Michigan's natural resources and rich outdoor heritage.

The three winners were selected from a highly-qualified pool of 27 applicants, representing ten Michigan colleges and universities. Recipients were selected for their clear passion for Michigan and its outdoor opportunities as well as their demonstrated commitment of introducing others to those opportunities such as: fishing, hunting, camping, boating and wildlife watching. The winners each received a \$1,000 scholarship to support their 2020-2021 academic expenses.

Rotary Saginaw Bay Nature Festival

The Muter Outdoor Fund began partnering with the Rotary Club of Standish and Pinconning in 2019 to help support their annual Saginaw Bay Nature Festival.

The festival seeks to connect people of all ages and backgrounds to our land and water and highlights the rich natural resources and recreational opportunities available to those in the Saginaw Bay Region. From March through May each year members of the Rotary Club host dozens of public outreach events ranging from classroom presentations, fishing clinics, school field trips, public tours, and arts activities for Saginaw Bay youth and their families.

THE IMPACT OF OUR INVOLVEMENT

2019 FESTIVAL

The Muter Outdoor Fund supported transportation expenses for nearly **100 4th grade students** from Standish-Sterling Elementary School to attend field trips to Pinconning Park where they explored and learned about Michigan's birds. At the Rotary's annual banquet in May 2019, the Muter Outdoor Fund pledged **\$1,000** to help sponsor the 2020 Festival.

2020 FESTIVAL

The sponsorship funds pledged in 2019, along with an additional \$670 contribution from the Muter Outdoor Fund in 2020, helped the Rotary Club purchase 12 digital camera kits to support the addition of youth and family nature photography programs to the Festival's 2020 activities. While most of the 2020 Festival's inperson activities were cancelled due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the Rotary carried out a successful youth art contest and distributed tree seedlings to approximately 3,000 elementary and middle school-students throughout Arenac and Bay Counties.

We look forward to continuing and deepening this important partnership with the Rotary Club and hope to support 2021 Festival programming in whatever format it may take. Check out the Rotary Saginaw Bay Nature Festival on Facebook for more great photos and updates.


